<p>So far this week you have shared a new story with a family member. You might have discussed the characters, what happens in the story and some of the new vocabulary. Now we would like you to read through the story again and pick out all of the vocabulary that describes how the characters are feeling. For example, sad, miserable, happy or excited. Are there any synonyms in your story?</p> <p><b>Synonyms are words with the same or similar meaning:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Words such as happy, cheerful and merry.</li><li>• Words such as sad, miserable and heartbroken.</li></ul> <p>You will need these words for your learning next week so keep them safe!</p>	<p>Now that you have had a little look at doubling and halving, we would like to focus in on halving. To begin with, we would like you to work on finding half of an amount. We are starting with amounts as it helps link to the learning you have already done on division.</p> <p>Please practise finding half of an amount by sharing objects into two equal groups. As always, linking the learning back to real life situations is always a good idea.
