You could discuss your answers with somebody, or write down your thoughts.




	What is the poem about?

**Maths**

This week, we are going to focus on our addition learning, to recap what we have learned in year 2. To start with, it is very important that you can quickly say pairs of numbers to make another number.

For example, all the pairs to make 7 (0+7, 1+6, 2+5, 3+4). We call these number bonds. We can represent these using part-whole models, like the one here.



Your task is to practise these number bonds so that you remember them quickly. You could use objects like pennies or lego to help you find them all. For these numbers, can you find all of the number bonds?

You could record them using part-whole models or as addition number sentences.

Can you remember them off by heart? What helps you learn them?


Can you balance one object on top of another in an unusual way?
