Have a look at the other texts below and think about what they have in common. Who might the intended **'audience'** be and what would be the **'purpose'** of the text?



Theme: Living things –

Today we are going to learn how to identify and classify a variety of British plants.

How could you organise these plants into groups?

The plants below have been put into two groups. Can you guess what criterion has been used to sort them?

apple tree rose bush fern moss

strawberry plant tulips ginkgo tree cedar tree

Have a look at the answers in the supporting information section to check how they were sorted.

Have a go at the next set of plants. Can you guess how they have been grouped?

daffodil pine trees wheat carrot plants

foxglove yew bush pear tree sunflower

Have a look at the answers in the supporting information section to check how they were sorted.

There are many things you can look at to help you identify trees. You can look at the shape of the tree itself, the shape of its leaves, as well as if anything is growing on the tree.

Here is a close-up of the leaves on this tree. Do they help you to identify what kind of tree it is?



It is an Oak tree. Oak trees grow acorns.

There are lots of different ways to help you identify plants you don't know the names of. You can use classification keys, you can look in plant guides and you can search online.

Why do you think it is important to be able to identify different plants?

Have a go at completing either worksheet 5A or 5B from the Living in Environments file. Use the plant cards to help you.

Have a look at the plants and trees in your garden or when you are next on a walk. Can you identify them?




