This is your new school uniform




When I come to school, I will wear school uniform...

waterproofs and a change of clothes in school.




When I come to school, I will come in

When I go to the toilet, I will need to go by myself. I will also need to remember to wash my hands carefully afterwards.




Assemblies...

We will eat our lunch in the school hall and then play in the Foundation Outdoor Area.




When I go home, I will leave through this






- ★ Let your child practise putting their new school uniform on and taking it off
