

John Rankin Sport Premium Action Plan and Impact Statement 2019-20

There are 5 key indicators we want to improvement across: **(A mix of old and new)**

1. the engagement of all pupils in an above average level of physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
2. The implementation of a fully diverse PE curriculum with less common sports in primary schools and the UK.
3. Assessment of PE and sport through careful planning and observation.
4. Increased level of external companies, staff lead clubs or activities for all children across the whole federation; especially those who do not currently attend clubs.
5. A detailed assessment of lunchtime play provision and increase in the number of activities that are available, run by both pupils and staff.
