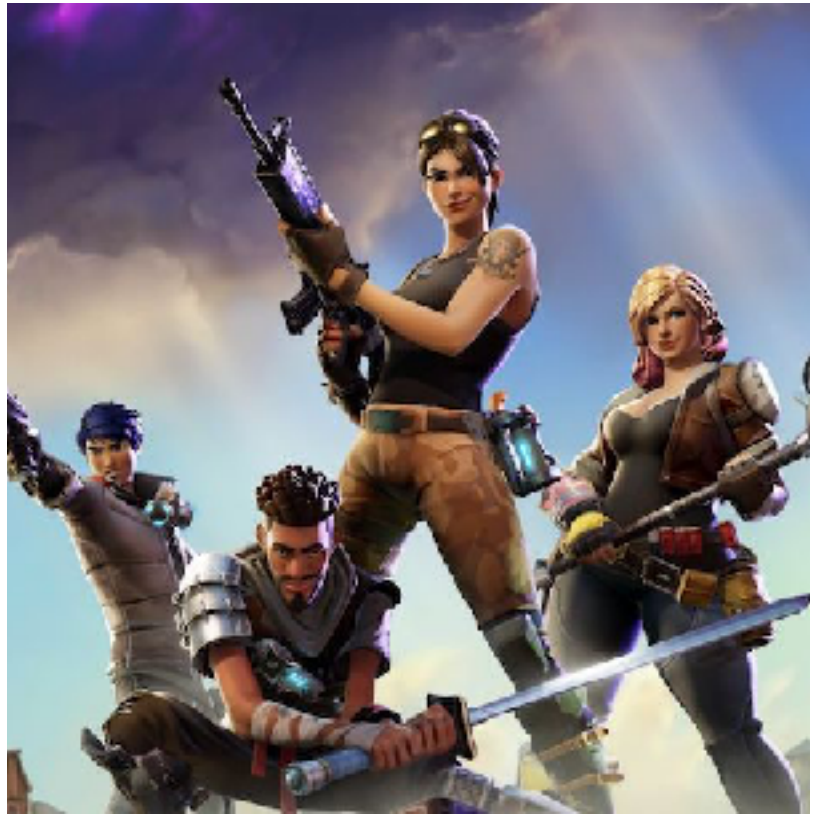
Epic Games created Fortnite about a year ago. Now it has over 200 million users all over the world logging in every day.

If you have a garden, ask your family to make sure there is grass and flowering plants for insects to live in.

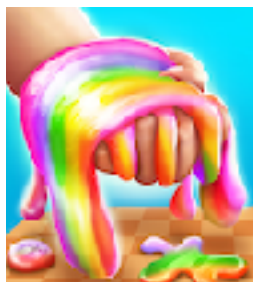
Why is recycling important?
