## Reminders ...

Just a reminder to parents and carers, that as part of our safeguarding policy we ask that children enter the school building in the morning independently where members of staff are there to supervise them. This is an extremely busy time of day where staff are responsible for looking after the children as they enter the building. There is very little room in the cloakrooms and as you can imagine having some unauthorised adults amongst the children at this time is a safeguarding issue.

In addition to this, whilst we understand that some children can become anxious at separation from their carer, prolonging this can also exacerbate this anxiety. Staff are happy to speak with parents and carers at arranged times to discuss strategies to support this.

If you wish to speak to a member of staff urgently, who is inside the building, please notify the office staff or if not urgent, after school would be more convenient.

Please would you make sure that your children, and their younger siblings, are supervised at all times before and after school in the playgrounds.

Please can we ask parents and carers to remind children to stick to the walkways when arriving and leaving school as it can be very dangerous to walk through the staff carpark. This has also been addressed in assembly so the children can understand the dangers more clearly—thank you for understanding.
