ENGLISH

AUTUMN TERM 1 - ANGLO SAXONS AND VIKINGS IN BRITAIN

History

Children will analyse sources of information to learn about:

- Settlement of Britain by Saxons and Vikings
- The structure of Anglo-Saxon society
- How Anglo Saxons lived their daily lives
- Alfred the Great and the resistance against Viking invasion
- Raider or trader: did the Vikings deserve their reputation?
- The Sutton Hoo burial find

Geography

Children will learn:

- The Anglo-Saxon invasions and the 7 kingdoms
- Counties of the UK and Anglo-Saxon place-names.







MATHS

We will be learning to:

- Recognise and use tenths, hundredths and thousandths and relate them to decimals
- Round any number up to 1 000 000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 10.000
- Read and write Roman numerals up to 1,000
- Add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods and mental
- Multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000; use factors, multiples and known facts to solve problems
- Measurement and time: length, volume, perimeter and area, time.
- Statistics: interpreting charts, graphs, timetables and 2-way tables

Charanga - music linked to theme

Symbolism in Tudor portraits, creating our own versions and interpreting Shakespeare plays using a variety of media.

AUTUMN TERM 2 - TUDORS
